

Conditions for Financial Support for IPG Research Activities and Publications

Following the Steering Committee's decision to redefine the team's needs and priorities with a view to the last phase of the project, funding priority will now be given to three types of activities:

Conditions and criteria	<p>\$25 000 per event has been set aside for conferences as provided for in the thematic three-year plan.</p> <p>The amount budgeted includes organization and participant travel and accommodation costs.</p>	<p><u>Request evaluation criteria:</u></p> <p>Publication of IPG research</p> <p>Promotion of the project team's work</p> <p>Publications related to the three-year plan of activities</p> <p>Editorial coordination (in the case of collective works)</p> <p>Collaboration with Aboriginal partners</p> <p>Student involvement</p> <p>Academic prestige of the publishing house or journal</p> <p>Dissemination costs (in the case of media other than paper)</p> <p>Translation (French, English, Aboriginal languages)</p> <p>Specific publication plan</p>	<p><u>In order to meet the requirements of the SSHRC, the following will be favoured:</u></p> <p>Participation of students who are directed by a co-researcher.</p> <p>Student work leading to a diploma (Master's theses, doctoral dissertations and/or field work) through the award of two scholarships of \$3000 each.</p> <p>Student work conducted in the context of a research assistantship for a project co-researcher.</p> <p>Student work related to the theme of indigenous governance.</p> <p>Student work that could lead to a publication.</p> <p>Student work involving Aboriginal communities or partners.</p>

Procedures

The funds will be paid immediately after the conference.

In order to be accepted, a request for support has to fulfill as many of the evaluation criteria as possible.

The decision to allocate funds will be taken by the IPG's steering Committee.

Publications can be funded until the end of the project's sixth year, in other words, until March 2012, when the project will end.

Requests must specify the costs, publication calendar and all information pertinent to assessing the extent to which the publication meets the evaluation criteria.

Scholarship and research assistant grant applications must be submitted in writing to Karine Gentelet, Coordinator (karine.gentelet@umontreal.ca)

Scholarship applications have to be endorsed by the research supervisor and submitted by the student.

Research assistant grant applications have to be submitted by co-researchers.

The deadlines for both types of applications are **November 15, 2010** and **March 15, 2011**.
